Maths:

Statistics - Children will draw, read and interpret graphs and tables

Shape - Children will understand and use degrees. They will classify and estimate angles. Then they will move on to measure and draw angles using protractors.

Position and direction - Children will read and plot coordinates. They will learn how to translate and reflect shapes on a grid, using coordinates.

D&T: Cooking & Nutrition

Pupils learn about healthy diets and food preparation and cooking skills. They practise safe, hygienic cooking, follow recipes, and make food choices to promote a healthy lifestyle.



History: Ancient Greeks

Pupils explore Ancient Greek civilisation and its influence on the modern world. Key aspects of Greek life will be covered: daily life, beliefs and gods, democracy, the Olympic Games, and famous achievements.



Computing: Vector graphics

Learners start to create vector drawings. They learn how to use different drawing tools to help them create images. characters for their game.



Science: Living things

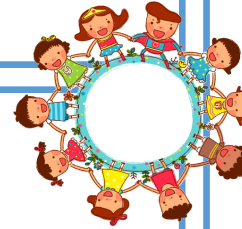


In this unit, children will learn how living things grow, change and reproduce. They will explore different plant life cycles, including sexual and asexual reproduction, and understand how pollination, fertilisation, seed dispersal and germination help plants grow.

PE:

Fitness - Pupils develop fitness through activities that build stamina, strength, speed, agility, balance, and coordination. Lessons encourage pupils to work at an appropriate level and improve technique.

Athletics - pupils develop their skills in running, jumping, and throwing, focusing on improving speed, stamina, power, and technique. Children practise a range of athletic activities.



PSHE: Relationships

Children will first look at themselves, their personality traits and self-esteem. They will then look at online relationships and how they interact online.

Music: Composition to represent the festival of colour (Theme: Holi festival).

Exploring the associations between music, sounds and colour; composing and performing their own musical composition to represent Holi.



English:

Class reader - Who Let the Gods Out? by Maz Evans

Character Description: Ancient Greek God
Children will employ ambitious, descriptive vocabulary within expanded noun phrases to craft a rich and engaging character description.

Leon and the gorgon's curse - non chronological report

Children will learn how to organise information under clear headings and write in an informative style.



RE: Inspirational women

Children will learn about a variety of women who have changed the world and their links to religion and worldviews.

They will learn about women from different points in history who are from different religious backgrounds e.g. Joan of Arc, Harriet Tubman, Shirin Ebadi, Hypatia Malala Yousafzai, Anne Frank and Rosa Parks.
